

#### The Nubians

- Later known as Kush
- Located in Africa
- South of Egypt
- Present-day Sudan





- Cattle herders were first to settle
  - Herded over the savannas
- Later people settled in farming villages
  - Along the Nile








- Did NOT rely on the Nile River
- Had rainfall and fertile soil all year long
- Farmers grew beans, yams, rice, and grains.
- Hunters and warriors excelled at bow & arrow



# The Rise of Kerma



- 9
- Stronger villages take over weak villages
  - Form the kingdom of Kerma
- Kerma grew wealthy from agriculture and mining gold
- Developed <u>trade</u> relationship <u>with</u>
  Egypt
  - Trade link between Egypt and southern Africa






- Egyptians acquired cattle, gold, incense, ivory, giraffes, leopards, and enslaved people
- Egyptians hired Nubians to serve in their armies
- Kerma's artisans produced pottery, jewelry, and metal goods




- Kerma kings had smaller tombs than Egyptian tombs.
- Buried with personal belongings
  - Including gems, gold, jewelry, and pottery







- <u>Egyptian armies invaded Nubia in</u><u>1400 BCE</u>
- Egypt conquered Kerma after a 50 year war
- Egypt ruled Kerma for 700 years





- Nubians adopted Egyptian culture
  - Worshipped Egyptian gods
  - Learned to use copper and bronze
  - Adapted hieroglyphics to fix their language
  - Created an alphabet


Nubians broke away from Egyptian rule during the Middle Kingdom



## The Rise of Kush



- Capital was Napata
- Located where trade caravans crossed Upper Nile
- Trade brought wealth to Kush



### Kush Conquers Egypt



- Founded the 25<sup>th</sup> dynasty
- Governed Egypt and Kush from Napata




- Kush <u>ruled</u> <u>Egypt for 60 years</u>
- Assyrians invaded Egypt
  - Defeated Kush with their iron weapons
- Kushites returned to their homeland.
  - Learned how to make iron tools
  - Boosted their military strength





- Rulers moved capital to Meroe
  - Near one of the Nile's cataracts
- Iron ore deposits found in Meroe
  - Made city major center for iron production
  - Major trading city







- Kush remained a great <u>trading kingdom for</u>
   600 <u>years</u>
- Axum emerged in present day Ethiopia
  - Gained strength from its location along the Red Sea
  - Served as a trading center
    - Mediterranean Sea to East Africa
  - Armies of <u>Axum</u> invaded <u>Kush</u> and <u>destroyed</u> <u>Meroe</u>
